Where do the funds go from *Ribs & Raffle Day?* All monies raised from *Ribs & Raffle Day* are reinvested back into our community. Here are some examples from 2008 of how your support helps to make your community safer.

- Public Education and Fire Prevention Programs \$2800.00. Fire prevention is more cost effective than fire suppression operations. By funding these types of programs fires injuries and property damage can be reduced or eliminated. These programs are targeted at children. The result is low incidences of fires ignited by children playing with fire.
- Replace Multi-Gas Detection Equipment \$1828.00. Replace a 18-year old multi-gas detection unit. Multi-gas detection sensors are used to identify the presence of carbon monoxide, oxygen levels, hydrogen-sulfide or explosive vapors/gases. This equipment is essential to conduct investigation into strange odors, CO alarms activations and determining safe atmospheres.
- Purchase Traffic Safety Vest \$800.00. In order to comply with the United States Highway Administration's rules, firefighters are now required to wear approved traffic safety vests at emergency operations on highways/roadways. The Highway Administration ordered all first responders to wear safety vest because of the high number of firefighters, police and EMTs being struck and killed along roadways.
- Purchase Rapid Intervention Team Equipment \$1200.00. Additional rescue ropes, webbing and equipment bags were acquired to enhance firefighters equipment cache for rescuing trapped or injured civilians or firefighters. Providing firefighters with the proper equipment is critical for on-scene safety.



Barbecue Grill Safety

- Keep grills at least 10 feet from siding and eaves.
- Never use a grill in a garage or carport.
- Before using a gas grill, check hoses and connections for leaks.
- Check that the venturi tubes-where gas and air mix-are not blocked.
- Never overfill a propane tank.
- Consumers should only use propane tanks that have a three-pronged valve: this is a sign that there is an over-fill protection device in the tanks.
- When lighting a charcoal grill, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add fluid after the fire is started.
- To dispose of hot coals, soak them with water and stir to make sure the fire is out.
- Never put coals in plastic, wood, or paper containers.
- Wear snug-fitting clothing when grilling.



During the course of the year, the Signal Hill Fire Department receives notices of recalls of various appliances, consumers goods, and other personal products.

For example, recently the Consumer Products Safety Commission recalled Kitchen Gourmet (r) 10-Cup Coffeemaker White, XQ-673K or W14A3714 and Signature Gourmet (tm) 12-Cup Programmable Coffeemaker, Black XQ-673BT or CM4193D, W14A5084. The name of the coffeemaker is printed on the front of the unit. The model number and the item number are printed on a sticker located on the bottom of the unit. These coffeemakers can ignite due to an electrical failure, posing a fire hazard. These units were sold at Walgrens Pharmacies.

Gasoline Safety

- **Never** use gasoline inside the home or as a cleaning agent.
- **DO NOT** smoke when handling gasoline Don't laugh, it does happen!
- Fill approved gasoline containers carefully. Take the container out of the vehicle or pickup truck bed. Place the container on the ground. Keep the pump nozzle in direct contact with the container at all times to avoid a static electricity discharge. Only fill the container to 95% capacity to allow for expansion.
- Allow gasoline fueled equipment to cool prior to refueling.
- Store gasoline is a tightly closed metal or plastic container approved by an independent testing testing laboratory. **NEVER** re-use plastic container such as milk jugs. **NEVER** use glass bottles.
- Store only enough gasoline necessary to fuel equipment.
